2. The Visitation Gospel

David's cry → Psalm 106:4

"Remember me, O Lord, in Your favor toward Your people; visit me with Your salvation."

Zechariah's prophecy → Luke 1:68, 78

"Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has **visited** (episkeptomai) and redeemed his people... By the tender mercy of our God, the rising sun will **come to** (episkeptomai) us from heaven to shine on those living in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the path of peace."

Jesus' Gospel → Mark 1:14-15

"Jesus went into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God. 'The time has come,' he said. 'The kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe the gospel!"

Jesus could declare that the kingdom had come near because the king himself had come near. God has come near to us in Jesus, a.k.a., **visited** us in Jesus!

Our Calling → James 1:27

"Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to **care for** (episkeptomai) orphans and widows in their distress."

Our Attitude → Philippians 2:3-4

Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others.

Your ministry of caring visitation is of divine importance because caring visitation reflects the Gospel perhaps better than any form of ministry.



3. He is Going Before You

What fears do you have as you imagine walking into the hospital, or someone's home, or a café to provide pastoral care?

Mark 16:6-7

"Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you."

Eugene Peterson, Under the Unpredictable Plant, 128

"In every visit, every meeting I attend, every appointment I keep, I have been anticipated. The risen Christ got there ahead of me. The risen Christ is in that room already. What is He doing? What is He saying? What is going on?

"In order to fix the implications of that text [Mark 16:6-7] in my vocation, I have taken to quoting it before every visit or meeting: 'He is risen, ... he is going before you to 1020 Emmorton Road; there you will see him, as he told you.' Later in the day it will be, 'He is risen, ... he is going before you to St. Joseph's Hospital; there you will see him, as he told you.' When I arrive and enter the room I am not so much wondering what I am going to do or say that will be pastoral as I am alert and observant for what the risen Christ has been doing or saying that is making a gospel story out of this life."

How does/would your perspective change if you saw things through the perspective of Mark 16:6-7, that Jesus is going before you to the hospital, to the home, to the café?

4. The Good Samaritan

Luke 10:25-37

Double love command for God & neighbour, followed by the Good Samaritan parable is the Scriptural underpinning of pastoral care.

'[W]here one's deeds are moved and shaped by love, there is neither time nor reason to ask, "Who is my neighbor?" ... Concrete deeds of love, not casuistic definitions of love's limits, should be [our] concern' (Howard Stone *The Caring Church*, 23).

Pastoral Care = "helping acts... directed toward the **healing**, **sustaining**, **guiding** and **reconciling** of troubled persons and the nurture of growth and wholeness of those seeking it" (Stone, *The Caring Church*, 14).
